Approve Minutes of the meeting of the Executive Board on March 10, 2023. Motion by Duprey Seconded by Benson; Motion carries by 4-0 vote, without abstentions.

Approve an initial resolution (resolution 23-02) to issue up to \$200,000,000 in tax-exempt and/or taxable revenue bonds for Joon Georgia, Inc., (Joon Georgia, Inc. Project), located in the State of Georgia.

Motion by Duprey Seconded by Benson; Motion carries by 4-0 vote, without abstentions.

Approve a final resolution (resolution 23-03) to issue up to \$50,000,000 in tax-exempt and/or taxable revenue bonds for The Estaugh t/a Medford Leas, (Medford Leas Project), located in the State of New Jersey.

Motion by Key-Wallace Seconded by Duprey; Motion carries by 4-0 vote, without abstentions.

Approve a final resolution (resolution 23-04) to issue up to \$4,600,000 in tax-exempt and/or taxable revenue notes for Calvary Fellowship Homes, Inc., (Calvary Fellowship Homes Project), located in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Motion by Duprey Seconded by Benson; Motion carries by 4-0 vote, without abstentions.

Approve a final resolution (resolution 23-05) to issue up to \$11,000,000 in taxable lease revenue bonds for Rainier Rockford, LLC, (VA Rockford Project), located in the State of Illinois. Motion by Duprey Seconded by Key-Wallace; Motion carries by 4-0 vote, without abstentions.
